Course Title: Scientific Communication Skills (IV)

Learning Objectives:

- 1. To understand the types and structure of scientific writing.
- 2. To understand the method of writing and practice writing.
- 3. To learn to write a paper or article incorporating all necessary components properly.

Number of Sessions: 06

Session 1 (2 lectures)

Recap of Semester III & Types and structure of scientific writings

- a) Explain the various types of scientific writing: Papers, Reviews Short communications, articles for newspapers, popular science writing, chapters in a text book etc.
- b) Discuss in detail the structure of a science paper using different journals in your subject.
- c) Exercise: students to be given papers to work on in groups. The students are asked to (i) list what all points are included in introduction and in discussion; (ii) Extract relevant method and tabulate it / determine the underlying principle. Preferably select papers of a more descriptive nature specially in the physical sciences and chemistry.

Session 2 (2 lectures)

Writing: the 'how to' of writing.

- a) Teacher input on the rules for: text, figures, tables, graphs etc. for e.g. punctuation, location legends, details...
- b) How to write a title? How to write an introduction? Ex- give photocopies of results. Ask students to (i) formulate title of paper and (ii) prepare an introduction i.e. list the points they would like to cover in the introduction.
- c) How to write a bibliography? Teacher input regarding different styles and of reference writing and variations for books, journals etc. Ex. Ask students to write names of 5 text books / reference books they normally use as if they were writing for the bibliography of their paper. Get 4-5 science magazines, let them pick an article in each and write it as a reference.
- d) How to gather information? (i) Literature survey from magazines, journals (letters / short communication / abstracts / articles / reviews), (ii) What are good journals/ authentic sites? (iii) search engines. Ex- As homework, give a topic (may be their assignment topic), students collect information----- number of references in each of the following categories: Books, Papers, Reviews...

Session 3 (2 lectures)

Writing

- a) 10-15 minute staff input on how to write a paper / article.
- b) Groups of 3-4 given papers maybe in study pack / asked to get papers in previous session and asked to read them.

- c) Create a new paper using a reference papers provided / collected for their project etc. (i) start with creating a title. (ii) write an introduction of 2 pages ...1 hour; (iii) groups present at 2 minutes / group30 minutes.
- d) Writing the result- teacher provides data / student project data.
- e) Home work- students complete paper and mail to teacher.

Session 4 (2 lectures)

Writing a simple research paper / article & presentation

- a) Teacher to discuss the plus and minus of all the submitted papers.
- b) Students revise papers keeping in mind the suggestions of the teacher.
- c) Teacher explains how to make a PowerPoint of the paper. (how many slides / what to write on ppt / what to say verbally, time per slide..)
- d) Keep a session with expert on how to make graphs.
- e) Students may start to design their slides, pointwise on paper.

Session 5 (2 lectures)

PPT Presentation

a) Practice presentations by 4-5 students, randomly selected; evaluation and discussion of positive and negative aspects.

Session 6 (2 lectures)

Evaluation and Feedback

a) A 5 minute presentation by each pair- 2.5 minute per person. Who will present 1^{st} and who 2^{nd} to be told just before they go up to present. 2 minutes to be given for questions and 2 minutes for change over. Therefore about 10 students per lecture.

A questionnaire will have to be prepared and circulated before the start of the evaluation / after they complete the evaluation.
